Your Board of Directors acting as a Hall of Fame Committee decided that we have many people who qualify to be elected to the Jasper County Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame, either for their bowling accomplishments or for their service to bowling in general or our association in particular. I will now quote directly from the nomination form.

1. List Bowling Achievements of Candidate: Member Iowa 600 Club, Member Iowa 20 Year Club, Member Jasper County Association Team Champion 1974, Jasper County Association Doubles Champion 1971, Jasper County Bowler of The Year 1976 with a high series of 663.
2. List Service Achievements of Candidate: Junior League Coach 1965-1977, League President Secretary and Treasurer - Too many years to count, Jasper County Assn. Board of Directors 1965-1967, 1971-1975, Jasper County Assn President 1968-1970, Jasper County Assn. Vice President 1975-to present, Iowa Women's Bowling Assn. 600 Club Secretary 1984 -1988.

3. Describe the Candidate: If ever a person loved the game of 10 pins, that person is Joan Huggins. In our league if there is a question about rules, it's always "ask Jo, she'll know". She generously shares her ability and experience with others. Since the passing of Lee Troen, if we're having problems with our game, we go to Jo. She has tremendous organizational ability. When she took on the job as secretary of the Iowa 600 Club, that ability was challenged to its utmost. But I know that when she passes on her job to another, the records will be in tip top shape. But perhaps her greatest asset is that she has so many friends and the reason for that is--she is a friend, always to be counted on when we need her.

Why the Candidate should be considered for Hall of Fame: Although Joan Huggins could be considered for induction into the Jasper County Hall of Fame on her bowling accomplishments alone, I feel that her years of service to bowling should be considered also. Sometimes good bowlers are not so generous with their time. Many of the fine young bowlers of Jasper County were introduced to the sport during her tenure as a Junior Coach. Some of them even listen to her yet. Throughout her years as a league officer she has served her fellow bowlers, both men and women, well. Since 1965 she has served our association on the Board of Directors, as an officer--no small accomplishment. For all of the above reasons, Joan Huggins is an ideal candidate for Hall of Fame induction.
